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Student - Student is defined as a senior who is serving as an assistant teacher.

Pupil - Pupil is a sophomore who is attending the class for reading/language services

On Task - On task means that student/pupil is engaged in desired behavior(s) without interruption.

<u>Attendance - Unverified Absence</u> - An absence is considered unverified if the student does not report the absence prior to being gone and arrange for another student to cover their assignment. All materials should be prepared and provided for the student.

<u>Preparation</u> - (1) Be in your seat before the tardy bell rings. (2) Have all materials for the day (including Channel One News Forms) ready before the tardy bell rings.

<u>Praise</u> - Verbal praise should be given to each pupil at frequent intervals. Praise should be varied and sincere. Examples would be: good reading carefully, thanks for following along, you read with a lot of expression, thanks for being ready, you are really paying attention today, I like the way you recognize and correct your mistakes, etc. etc.

Record Keeping - Awarding of points to pupils is based on data collected and objective observation. Awarding of points is consistent.

Behavior Management - Students should explain behavioral expectations to pupils and should maintain on-task behavior at all times. Expectations should include (but not necessarily be limited to): (1) Pupil should be in his/her seat and ready to begin by the time the tardy bell rings; (2) Pupil should follow directions immediately when given; (3) Pupil will stay on task until work is completed or directed to stop; (4) Pupil will ask student assistant for help when pupil does not understand assignment/directions or for permission to stop task or be excused.

Role Model - Student will exhibit appropriate behavior at all times while in class. This behavior includes (1) Maintain mature and appropriate conversations with students, (2) Exhibit on-task behavior at all times; (3) Dress appropriately; (4) Exhibit good organizational skills; (5) Use appropriate language; (6) Give clear understandable directions; (7) Maintain a pleasant, friendly, supportive attitude; (8) Other behaviors as identified by the teacher.
