Admittance to Special Education is competitive.

Applications are due October 1 of every year.

Application to the Special Education Major

- Must have the above requirements met
- Application is due every year by October 1. Students typically apply during their sophomore year.
- The application can be found on the Special Education Website <http://sped.usu.edu>
- Admitted students must then complete the professional education coursework during spring semester before they can begin the special education coursework
- Admission to the special education major is competitive. The minimum GPA for application is 2.75. Because of the competition, however, the students who are admitted often have a much higher GPA.
- The following factors are considered when reviewing applications:

- Teacher education requirements met.
- GPA
- Documented prior experience helping people with disabilities
- Total number of credit hours completed

If you do not have experience working with students with disabilities, you might want to consider talking to Darcie about SPED4910. This class gives you experience in local schools working with students with disabilities. You must fill out a SPED 4910 contract to be in this course.
